ZiMUN JCC Procedure:

The Joint Crisis Committee (JCC) is a committee where delegates deal with real-time issues and developments. It is a whole-delegation plenary session to bring together delegations and address issues of timely global significance.

Country Assignment

Each participating school is assigned a set of countries (indicated above), with delegates representing these countries banding together to form a delegation. **If a delegation only has one representative, they join another larger delegation from their school. Individual delegates, please join another school with the same country.**

Historical Commission Countries

Because some of the countries in the Historical Commission are different to the ones today, please just join a larger delegation that your school is allocated to.

Operative Clause Submission

It is mandatory for each delegation to draft and submit one operative clause, along with any necessary sub-clauses. This operative clause should reflect the delegation's stance and proposed solutions on the issue. Please discuss with your delegation as a whole before submitting this operative clause. The submission deadline is **3 pm on Friday, March 7th**, and all submissions are to be submitted via the designated Google Form linked [HERE](#).

General Debate Procedure

The JCC follows the general debate procedure present in all committees. However, each delegation that has submitted an operative clause has one delegate designated as their ambassador/main submitter.

Each operative clause is treated like a resolution, meaning that:

- Delegates will ask POIs to the main submitter after their speech.
- Delegates may and are encouraged to propose amendments to modify the operative clauses, with these amendments then being debated and voted upon.
- Delegates deliver speeches both for and against the operative clause.

When the House votes on each operative clause, the delegation votes **together**, casting one vote. Operative clauses that receive a majority of votes are passed and added to the main resolution.
